

The assessors shall ascer-tain as nearly as possible, the particu-lars of the real estate, the personal property, and the income of any per-son, who has not brought in a stat-ment in accordance with their notice and as required by this law, and shall make an estimate thereof at the true value and amount, to the best of their information and belief; and such esti-mate shall be conclusive upon all persons who have not filed their stat-ments in due time, unless they can show a reasonable excuse for the unission."


