IMPROVEMENT SHOWN IN P. E. FINANCES

When Premier Matheson delivered his budget speech last night, he estimated the deficit for the fifteen months ending 31st December, 1912, at \$1,000,000.

The government had the year's increase of subsidy, \$50,000 obtained through the representations made by the Premier and his colleagues to the Federal Ministers. But the highly satisfactory result shown by Mr. Rossborough is, notwithstanding, an evidence of careful management that will be appreciated by every intelligent man in the province—the more so when it is remembered that the assets of the province have been increased by twelve steel bridges, by an anti-tuberculosis hospital at Falconbridge, and by other permanent improvements costing \$67,154.56.
