MONEY MARKET BADLY SMASHED

Canadian Dollars Are Two Cents Lower at 88.50 Rate

New York, Nov. II.—The foreign exchange murket as expressed in terms of the United States dollar was again extremely nervous today. Canadian dollars dropped one per cent. from yesterday's close to 88.50, as against 90.25 a week ago. Today's quotation is the lowest point reached for some months.

Heavy offerings of grain and cotton bills caused sterling to fall to 3.35 1-4 for demand bill as against the prewar quotation of 4.86 5-8. Today's low was 4 1-2 cents under the recent best, but considerably over the low record of last February when sterling fell to 3.13.
