Tupper, Hon. Charles, C. B., M. D., L. R.

C. S. (Edin.) [Cumberland.] C.

Family originally came from Hesse Cassel to Guernsey, thence to Virginia, and subsequently removed to Nova Scotia with the Loyalists, when the United States gained their independence. S. of the Rev. Charles Tupper, D. D., of Aylesford, N. S. B. at Amherst, N. S., 2 July, 1821. Ed. at Horton. N. S. Took the degree of M. D. at Edingburgh, and obtained the diploma of the Royal College of Surgeons (Edin.,) in 1843. M. in Oct., 1846, Miss Frances Morse, of Amherst. Is President of the Canadian Medical Association, (elected in Oct., 1867. at the Medical Conference in Quebec; ) and a Governor of Dalhousie College, Halifax, since 1862. Was Provincial Secretary, N. S., from 1857 to 1860, and again from 1863 to 1867. In 1864 he became Prime Minister of N. S. a position which he retained until the Union. Was a delegate to England on public business in 1858, and again in 1865. Was a mem. of the Charlottetown Union Conference. 1864; of that at Quebec in the same year; and of the final Conference of Colonial Delegates in London, 1866-7, which submitted to the Imperial Government the plan and terms of the Union of the B.
