



MEMORIAL presented by his Majesty's Commissaries to the Commissaries of his Most Christian Majesty, in Reply to their Memorial of the 4th of *October* 1751, concerning *Nova Scotia* or *Acadia*.

**T**HE Commissaries of the King of *Great Britain* having on the 21st of *September* 1750, and on the 11th of *January* 1751, delivered two Memorials to the Commissaries of the Crown of *France*, one setting forth the Limits with which the King of *Great Britain* claims the Country of *Acadia* or *Nova Scotia*, in *North America*, as ceded to him by the Treaty of *Utrecht*; the other containing the Reasonings and Proofs in Support of his Majesty's Right; and the *French* Commissaries having in their Answer to these Memorials, dated the 4th of *October*, 1751, assigned different Limits to this Country, we shall now proceed to consider the whole Argument and Matter of that Memorial.
