## LEES, WILLIAMS, J.P. (South Lanark.)

Father, William Lees, and family, emigrated from Scot. in 1817, and settled in the Tp. of Bathurst, now the Co. of Lanark, Ont. B., 1821, in the Tp of Bathurst. Ed. there. M., 1st, 1844, Mary, dau of Col. Playfair; 2nd, Annie Laurie, formerly school teacher in Perth. A farmer and saw and grist mill owner. He had a seat in the Tp. and Co. Councils from 1856 until 1880.
