

studied medicine at McGill College, where he took his degree, 1845. Unmarried. Served as surgeon at Quarantine, Grosse Isle, during 1847 (fever year) and 1848. Aided in 1849 in forming a special mounted constabulary force for quelling disturbances of the peace in Montreal and adjoining districts, a troop of which was placed under his command. Was stipendiary magistrate for the protection of the fisheries in the lower River and Gulf of St. Lawrence from 1852 until the Union, when he resigned, and as such, commanded first, the armed steamer *Doris*, and afterwards the armed schooner *La Canadienne*, built specially for the service, from which latter vessel he was wrecked in Nov., 1861, during a violent storm on the North Coast. First returned to Parlt. at last g. e. for present seat in both Houses, by acclamation. Re-elected to Local House at last g. e. by acclamation. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir George Cartier.—*Quebec ; Laprairie.*
