

MACLENNAN, JAMES, Q.C. [*North Victoria, Ont.*]

S. of the late Mr. Roderick MacleNNan, who came to Can., with his father, about 1795, and settled in the Tp. of Lancaster, Glengarry, Ont. B. there, 17 March, 1833. Ed. at the Williams-town Grammar School, and afterwards at Queen's College, Kingston, where he took degree of B. A., 1849. M., June, 1862, Elizabeth McGill, only dau. of the late James M. Strange, Esq., of Toronto. Called to the Bar, Ont., Michaelmas Term, 1857. Created a Q.C., 1873. Elected a Benchler of the Law Society, 1871. A mem. of the law firm of Mowat, MacleNNan and Downey, and is a mem. of the Council of Public Instruction, Ont. First returned to Parlt., for present seat, at last g.e. A Reformer.—104, Bloor St., Yorkville, Toronto.

MACKAY, NEWTON LEGAYET, Q.C. (*Cape Breton.*)

Of Scottish descent. S. of the late William Mackay, Esq., C.E. A native of Halifax, N.S. Ed. at Dalhousie College, in that city. M. Kate dau. of E. C. Brown, Esq. Called to the Bar N.S., 1859. Created a Q.C., 1872. Is County Treasurer for Cape Breton. An unsuccessful candidate for Cape Breton in N.S., Assembly at 1867, and at g.e., 1871. First returned to
