Is a dir. of the Brockville and Ottawa Railway. Was Warden of Lanark and Renfrew, and after division of those Counties, of Lanark. Sat for North Lanark in Local Assembly from g.e., 1867, until July, 1872, when he resigned, to contest seat for Commons. Returned at last g.e. A Liberal, and an opponent of present Govt.—Almonte, Ont.

GAUDET, JOSEPH, J.P. [Nicolet.]

A mem. of the Council of Agriculture for Quebec. Sat for present seat in Can. Assembly from g.e., 1857, until the Union. Returned to Commons at g.e., 1867, and again at last g.e. Represented same seat in the Local House from g.e., 1867, until g.e., 1871. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir G. Cartier—Gentilly, Que.
