

thousand Quarters; and from the Port of Port Glasgow, Ten thousand Quarters; at any Time or Times before the first Day of January, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-seven, to his Majesty's Sugar Colonies in America, for the Sustenance and Use of the Inhabitants of the said Colonies: And that it shall and may be lawful to ship and export Biscuit and Pease, out of and from the several Ports in this Kingdom herein-after mentioned, to the several Places herein-after named, for the Benefit of the British Fishery carried on in those Parts, so as the same do not exceed the several Quantities respectively limited to those Places, any Thing in the said recited Acts, or either of them, to the contrary notwithstanding; (that is to say),

Certain Quantities of Biscuit and Pease allowed to be exported to Newfoundland, &c. for the Benefit of the Fishery, from the Ports herein-after mentioned.

*From the Port of London.* To the Island of Newfoundland, Two hundred and fifty Tons of Biscuit, and Three hundred Quarters of Pease.

To Nova Scotia, Two hundred Tons of Biscuit, and Three hundred Quarters of Pease.

To Bay Chaleur, Two hundred Tons of Biscuit, and Three hundred Quarters of Pease.

To Labrador, Two hundred Tons of Biscuit, and Three hundred Quarters of Pease.

*From the Port of Bristol.* To Newfoundland, Two hundred Tons of Biscuit, and Two hundred and fifty Quarters of Pease.

To Nova Scotia, One hundred and fifty Tons of Biscuit, and Two hundred Quarters of Pease.

To Bay Chaleur, One hundred and fifty Tons of Biscuit, and Two hundred Quarters of Pease.

To Labrador, One hundred and fifty Tons of Biscuit, and Two hundred Quarters of Pease.

*From the Port of Poole.* To Newfoundland, Three hundred Tons of Biscuit, and Three hundred Quarters of Pease.
