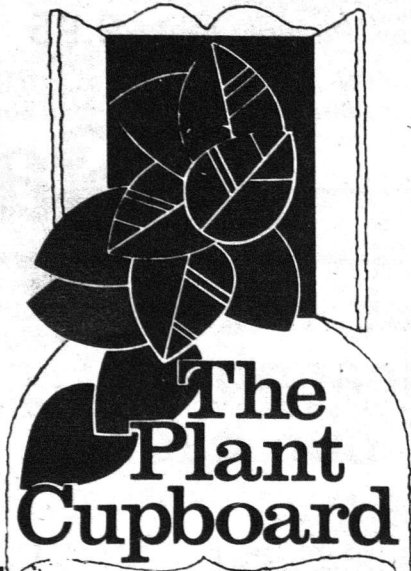

LRT comes to campus

City officials were in a quandary yesterday when the LRT "mole" was discovered missing.

The machine, used for digging the underground portion of the Jasper Avenue extension, had not been used for three weeks. In that time, someone mysteriously moved it and set it digging on the south side of the High Level bridge.

The mole travelled towards the university all the way to 114 Street, where it abruptly turned south and headed for the university farm. It was finally found poking to the surface near the university hospital.

The theft of the mole was concealed by a small cave-in where the mole was last digging. All traces of the possible theft were concealed by the dirt and mud.

millions of dollars for damages," says Phil Walker, city commissioner. "It will mean a total re-evaluation of our plans."

But university officials were not distraught by the development.

"Goody, goody, goody," said vice-president planning and development, Bum Phillips. "This means they'll have to give us... I mean, I regret that the city was inconvenienced by this development."

Phillips suggested that the university would not press charges of trespassing against the city if they would consider using the nearly completed tunnel for an underground LRT station on campus.

The mole left a trail of destruction in its wake, severely damaging several houses in North

Garneau. Coincidentally, the only houses damaged were the ones from which students have been evicted for violations of fire regulations.

"I really can't explain the situation," said Phillips. "It's also really lucky we delayed the opening of the HUB-Fine Arts walkway, because the mole went right underneath, almost upsetting the entire project."

The only building in the path of the mole which avoided damage was University Hall, which houses university administration officials.

Police have no suspects, but a few clues were found inside the mole. They include a copy of the university staff publication of *Folio* and a dozen World Student Games pins.
