
Vandalism is increasing, according to the latest Peel Board of Education

During the first six months of this year, reported damage to board property totalled \$119,040. compared to \$95,201 last year during the same period.

August figures show damage at \$14,342, compared to \$12,667 during the same month last year.

The figures cover the board of education's six school districts.

Vandalism in two of the districts or "units" has decreased by nearly 30 per cent. In Unit 1, Applewood, Glenforest, Unit 2, (Cawthra Park,
