In order that we may take advantage of our
labour here at the school in the greater production
campaign, would the Department consider giving us a
tractor. We have 300 acres under cultivation and a
limited number of horses. I may say also that our in-
come is limited. This year it is costing well on to
\$20,000.00 to run this school. Of this the Department
is furnishing less than \$9,000.00; the farm and Church
is making up the rest. The two items of salary and
clothing will about eat up the Department grant. During
the last five years I have spent thousands of dollars
on equipment here out of the school funds. I can still
keep going but a little help would be appreciated.
