Further to your letter of January 19th last, file 33-6-6119, in respect to Comox Indian Reserve No.1, I beg to advise you when I was in Comox recently I took this up with the Band, but as they did not seem to be able to give me the desired information, I interviewed Mr. Shelderup, B.C.Land Surveyor at Courtenay who has done much work for the Department, and who very kindly went through the Field Notes of the original survey with me as contained in your letter.

Mr. Shelderup would like to have the Field Notes and Surveyor's Report on the resurvey of this Reserve which was made on the 26th of February, 1926, under B.C.No.316. He has promised that if you will let him have these he will go through the report and field notes for us without charge, and possibly be able to locate the difficulty and give us a guide to work from.

If you would kindly forward these to me I will again take the matter up with a view to getting it

cleared up and settled.
