Dear Sir:

In my letter to you of September 20th I asked you to write me immediately stating what formal applications had been made by you for Indian trap-line registrations since the Prince Rupert conference and to submit a full list showing the dates of all applications as well as particulars of the applications, by this, of course, meaning the areas covered by these applications. I subsequently wrote you on September 28th in regard to Inspector Sandys Wunsch not having assisted in the registration of Indian trap-lines in the Liard-McDames area of your Agency. Your letter of October 12th covering a sheef of correspondence had with the Inspector and others does not contain any information as to whether, as a result of the Prince Rupert conference, you made subsequent application for lines in the eres mentioned thereby following up the work which we had hoped the Inspector would do. If you will give me the list asked for I shall be able to see for myself exactly what applications have been made by you in that area. If it transpires that this area has not been fully covered it is hoped that you will lose no time in having formal applications made to the Prince Rupert office so that final touches may be given to the completion of all trap-line matters in the Stikine Agency. I have been informed by Mr. Van Dyk that the main work of Indian registration in your Agency is now done but I want to be quite sure about the district above mentioned for it seems that that area has been a bone of contention for some time past.
