And Mr. Speaker having put the question, That the said Bill do pass? It was,

RESOLVED in the affirmative, nemine contradicente.

ORDERED, that Mr. Bourdages do carry back the Bill to the Legislative Council, and inform them, that this House hath agreed to the same, without any amendment.

The order of the day, for the House to resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the Message from His Excellency the Governor in Chief to this House, the thirteenth instant, intimating that Pierre Bedard, Esquire, elected to serve as a Member for the County of Surrey, was apprehended and committed for treasonable practices, being read;

The House resolved itself into the said Committee.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair.

Mr. Debartzeb took the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair;

And Mr. Debartzch reported, that the Committee had come to leveral resolutions, which he was directed to submit to the House, whenever it shall be pleased to receive the same.

ORDERED, that the Report be now received.

And he read the Report in his place, and afterwards delivered it in at the Table, where the Resolutions were again read by the Clerk.

The faid Resolutions are as followeth: videlicet;

Resolved, that it is the opinion of this Committee, that Pierre Bedard, Esquire, was one of the Representatives for the Lower Town of Quebec, in the last Provincial Parliament, at the time of its prorogation, on the twenty-fixth February last.
