"They are affured, that their Proceedings in this Session will be a convincing Proof to your Excellency of their sleady and inviolable Duty to His Majesty, from which principal (cultivated by their warmest Affections) they will never on any Occasion depart; justly fensible of the innumerable Blessings and Advantages which this Prowince in a peculiar Manner enjoys under the Government of our Most Gracious Sovereign, we flatter ourselves with the hope, that the same grateful Sentiments with which every Heart is now warmed, will continue to distinguish this House in all its suture Sessions.

"It is with the greatest Satisfaction that I do in the Name of the Commons, and by their particular Command, return to your Fx-cellency their unfeigned Thanks for your Prudence and Candour in the Execution of the high Trust committed to you, and more especially for your great Care and Attention to the Expenditure of public Money, and we feel the most pleasing Assurances, that the Happiness and Tranquility, which this Province now enjoys will not be interrupted so long as your Excellency shall continue to preside over it."

Bills assented to.

His Excellency was then pleased to give his Assent to the following Bills:

- A Bill, entitled, An As for the better Support of the Poor in the respessive Counties within this Province by laying an Impost Duty on all Articles imported into this Province from the United States of America, except as are berein after excepted.
- A Bill, entitled, An Ast for the better Regulation of Elections.
- A Bill, entitled, An Ast for founding, establishing and maintaining a College in this Province.
- A Bill, entitled, An Ast to enable the Inhabitants of the Town Plot of Dartmouth to use and occupy the Common Field granted them by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, in such way as they may think most beneficial to them.
- A Bill, entitled, An Ast to provide for the better support of the Puisne Judges of His Majesty's Supreme Court.
- A Bill, entitled, An Act for establishing the Times of holding an Inferior Court of Common Pleas and General Sessions of the Peace in the Township of Yarmouth.
- A Bill, entitled, An Ast for altering the Times of holding the Court of Common Pleas and General Sessions of the Peace in the District of Colchester.
- A Bill, entitled, An Ast in further Addition to an Ast made in the 32d Year of the Reign of King George the Second, entitled, An Ast for preventing Trespasses.
- A Bill, entitled, An Att for applying certain Monies therein mentioned for the Services of the Year 1789, and for appropriating the Supplies granted in this Session of General Assembly, and for funding the Province Debt.

Then the Secretary of the Province, by His Excellency's Command, declared the General Assembly prorogued to Wednesday the First Day of July next, and the same was prorogued accordingly.
