Mr. Speaker,

The Council have agreed to the Bill intitled an Act, to explain and amend an Act, passed in the seventh Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled an Ast, for partition of Lands in Co-parcenary, joint Tenancy and Tenancy in Common and thereby for more effestually collecting bis Majesty's Quit Rents in the Colony of Nova-Scotia, without any Amendment.

The Council have agreed to the Bill, intitled an Act to revive and continue an Act, passed in the 33d Year of his prefent Majesty's Reign, intitled an Act, in Amendment of, and Addition to an Act, made in the 33d Year of the Reign of his late Majesty, intitled an Act, for regulating and maintainig a Light House on Sambro Island, and in Addition to, and in Amendment of an Act, passed in the 28th Year of his Present Majesty's Reign, intitled an AS, for regulating and maintaining a Light-House at the Entrance of the Harbour of Shelburne, without any Amendment.
