

Heat in the Comstock Mines. "The Comstock mine in Nevada is a wonderful work," said Mr. Cecil Morgan, of Aspen. "It is 3,300 feet in a verti-cal line to the bottom of the shaft, and one can make the descent in three or four minutes in the cage which is used to haul ore to the surface. This cage will lift about 6,000 pounds, or three car-loads of 2,000 pounds each. Work on the Comstock is now confined to the upper levels, the work-men having been driven from the depths by the steam generated through the action of the air on the sulphurous rock penetrated by the different levels. The temperature averages about 190 degrees down there, and it is simply impossible for the miners to work under such conditions. Whether sai-ence will ever be able to overcome the diff-uties met with in those lower levels re-mains to be seen.
