The following communication has been received from Lord Chelmsford:

"I regret to have to report a very disastrous engagement on the 22nd of January between the Zulus and a portion of number—three column, which was left to guard the camp about ten miles in front of Roeke's drift. The Zulus came down in overwhelming numbers, and in spite of gallant resistance by five companies of the First Battalion of the 24th, Regiment, one company of Second Battalion of the 24th, two guns, two rocket tubes, 164 mounted men and about 800 natives, they overwhelmed them. The camp containing all surplus ammunition and transport No. 3 Column was taken and but few of its defenders escaped. Our loss, I fear, must be set down at 30 officers and about 500 noncommissioned officers and men of the Imperial troops and seventy noncommissioned officers, rank and file of the Colonial troops.
