H. H. Schaefer, who was for some time connected with the I. C. R. freight department at Moncton, has been notified of his appointment as district freight agent with office at Halifax.

It is rather surprising to learn, from a table recently published, that the United States postal service in 1895, the year just at the close of the civil war, was not only self-sustaining, but gave a profit of nearly \$1,000,000. For the next thirty years, and up to the present, the balance has always been the other way, the deficits varying in amount and generally increasing as the years passed, the excess of expenditure over revenue in 1896 being well on to \$10,000,000. In thirty years the revenue increased from about 14 1/2 millions to nearly 77 millions, and the expenditure from about 13 1/2 millions to nearly 87 millions. In Great Britain the postal service, also includes the telegraph, gives a large surplus every year, but that is a small country, with a dense population and an enormous business. Canada, of course, has an annual deficit in her postal service—a thing to be expected in a large, sparsely settled country and a thing much to be preferred to official speculation in postage stamps.
