CARELESS PARENTS

On several occasions we have drawn attention to the fact that the public streets are unsafe places for children to play. That many of these street-playing children escape injury is miraculous and it is indeed fortunate that so few accidents occur. Notwithstanding the fact still remains that it is dangerous for them to play on the streets and sooner or later the fact will be demonstrated to the deep regret of some parents, who allow their children to indulge in this habit. It is difficult for us to understand how some parents expect to have their children go home with a whole skin; considering that they permit them to run the streets of the town almost from daylight until long after dark. Frequently the police warn these children and at times run them home, but where disobedience is permitted in the home, these same children have very little regard for the orders of the authorities. These children spend the greater portion of their time begging nickels and dimes; chasing the spare tires of automobiles and corner-dodging the police. If the parents of these children continue their present thoughtless attitude it will become necessary for the authorities to take a hand in the matter and in some way prevent them from allowing their children the freedom of the streets at all hours. If the present state of affairs continues, a fatal accident will surely result and the fact that such has not already been recorded, up to the present time, is the best piece of luck that these parents have ever had thrust upon them.
