The Irish Hierarchy.

The following statement on the

present position of the Irish

question was drawn up and

unanimously adopted at the recent

meeting of the archbishops and

bishops of Ireland, held in the

college of Maynooth, on Wednesday

and Thursday, the 27th and 28th ult:

"Having become aware from the

recent comments of many of the

leading organs of public opinion

throughout Europe that a wide-

spread misconception still prevails

as to the existing state of the

Irish land question, we deem it our

duty to make the following statement

on the subject:

"We do not aim at enumerating

all the grievances of the agricultural

tenants of Ireland which may be

justly complained of, but we fully

recognize the impossibility of dealing

with many of them in the present

session of parliament. But in our

opinion certain most pressing

grievances which, in the interest

of public order as well as of justice,

imperatively call for immediate

redress:

"I. The fundamental demand of

the agricultural tenants of Ireland

in the matter of rent, is as it has

always been, a reasonable and

equitable one, for the establishment

of an impartial public tribunal
