

Found Drowned.

GEO. GORMAN'S BODY BROUGHT TO TOWN LAST NIGHT.

Yesterday the Telegram gave an account of the report given to the police of the disappearance of George Gorman, who with a man named Walsh went fishing on Tuesday at Western Barrens Pond, near Petty Harbor. Head Constable Sparrow and Constable Faraday, who took jiggers with them and went in the search with the man Walsh, Gorman's friend and companion, were not long finding the body. Gorman, it seems, left Walsh to bathe in another part of the pond Wednesday forenoon, and after Walsh had waited some time, he left the place and arrived in St. John's in the early afternoon. Gorman's failure to come home was reported yesterday, and Hd. Sparrow and Const. Faraday, taking Walsh with them, were not long searching the section indicated by Walsh before his clothing was found. They dragged the pond with their jiggers the body was taken from the bottom of the pond in very deep water and about 40 feet off shore. The remains were nude, and the belief is that poor Gorman while swimming was seized with one of the fainting fits to which he was subject and must have drowned quickly. The remains were brought to the city last night and placed in the morgue. The deceased was a shipwright by trade, was about 55 years old, and leaves a widow and six children to mourn him. Much sympathy is expressed for the family, in which the Telegram joins.



Harbor Grace Regatta.

Owing to the prevalence of a very high wind Wednesday, the Hr. Grace Regatta, which takes place annually at Lady Lake, had to be postponed. It was held however yesterday, when excellent weather prevailed, and was attended by a large gathering of people. It was held under the auspices of the Hr. Grace Volunteer Fire Brigade and seven races in all took place. These were Tradesmen, Amateurs, Societies, Juveniles, All-Comers, Laborers and Fishermen. The boats which competed were the Bessie, owned by the L.O.A. and coxswained by Robert French; Maggie, owned by the S.O.E. and steered by J. C. Ash; Winnie, owned by the C.B.B.S. and steered by E. Rodgers; Myrtle, steered by W. Carson; the Edith, by J. L. Oke, and the C. D. L. A., owned by that organization and steered by M. Stapleton. Up to the time our informant left the course, at 4.30 p.m., five races had been run off and there was great excitement amongst the contestants. The Bessie won the Tradesmen's, Laborers' and Society, and the Maggie the Amateur and Juvenile races. The many present were delighted with the manner in which the Regatta was conducted. Orderliness and sobriety prevailed and each event was contested in a sportsmanlike manner, the crews rowing well and proving themselves excellent oarsmen.

Fire at Bishop Falls.

(Message to Daily News.)
BISHOP'S FALLS, Last Night.
A big fire started about one p.m. on the south side of Explotis River, two miles east of Great Battling Brook. There is also a fire on the north side near Diamond Crossing, the latter being under control. The mill has been closed down, and all the men from here and Grand Falls fought the fire. The wind is blowing a strong breeze from the south west causing the fire to work back from the mill, and burning some plywood stacked by the river's edge. A big quantity of railway ties on the Reid Nrd. Co.'s track close to the trestle, have been also destroyed, but the trestle has not been damaged. The fire on the south side of the river is still raging, and is beyond control, but the settlement is now out of danger. The cause of the south side fire is unknown. The north side fire is supposed to have been caused by the train going west this p.m. Up to the present, it is impossible to estimate the amount of damage done, or where the fire, which is now working east, will end.
