

What Italy Has **Accomplished Since** She Entered Arena.

"The General Staff herewith presents a review of the operations on our front from the begining of the war and the result of our offensive:

"In the Trentino we have conquer ed the line from the Valle Davana to sion and the Valle Terregnolo, there- boundaries." by redeeming a rich and populous region, securing the two southern and most threatening extremities of this salient, which extends from the west to the east of the Lago di Garda to within a score of miles of the Brescia-Verona highway.

On the eastern side of this salient several roads passing between the Adige and the Brenta Rivers lead from the frontier and seek the level ground between Verona and Vicenza. Here had been placed the most formidable Austrian defences forming the most threatening zone for an invasion of the level land of Veneta.
