(Authority for the above—Letter sent by 9151 Sergt. Major Thomson, 3rd Battalion Canadians, from Giesesen, Hesse, Germany, dated July 10th, to Canadian Red Cross Society, London.)

No. 991—Private Cyril Richards, South River, C. B. Wounded dangerously—seriously ill (Typhoid). Admitted Wandsworth; gunshot wound, fractured skull.

NOTE—In forwarding this telegram His Excellency the Governor observes that the information respecting the men now reported as Prisoners of War is not official, but as it comes through the Canadian Red Cross Society it can be relied upon. These two men are Prisoners of War in the Hessian Camp, a Camp well reported on by the American Embassy, and as the Hessians are connected with the English Royal Family, and have always been more or less friendly to England, the men will no doubt be better treated than if they were in the Prussian Camps.

Prominent Citizen of Harbor Grace Passes Away.

On Saturday at midnight, one of the most highly respected and prominent citizens of Harbor Grace passed away, in the person of Charles L. Kennedy, Sr. The late Mr. Kennedy was an American citizen, but the greater part of his life was spent in this country. His affection for his native land remained strong to the end; it was only equalled by his love for his adopted land and the home of his wife and children. He came to Newfoundland in 1858 as engineer of the tug "Dauntless," a side paddle steamer owned by C. F. Bennett & Co., the first of its class to come to the country. In 1869 he went to reside in Harbor Grace and in a short time started in business as a tinsmith, brass and copper worker, adding also hardware. He conducted a very successful business until the crash of 1894, when adverse commercial conditions compelled him to limit his undertakings.

He married a daughter of a famous fish-killer of Harbor Grace, the late Captain Patrick Kelly, who survives him. There are also seven children surviving, viz: Miss Lizzie, a Graduate Nurse; Charles, now conducting the business; William, Assistant Post-Master, and Ronald, Principal of the R. C. Academy, all at Harbor Grace; Michael, Mgr. and shareholder in Joyce Bros., & Co. of Boston, Mass, and Mrs. Thomas Keefe and Mrs. Harry Strapp of the same city.

The late Mr. Kennedy was an exemplary citizen in every way, ever ready for any public service. In his early years and in middle life no movement in his adopted city was complete without his co-operation. His advice was sought on all occasions. He was a man of strong opinions, fearless and outspoken in his expression of them, but withal the pink of courtesy and chivalry; he was a devout Catholic, a life-long (or nearly so) total abstainer, charitable to a fault; in fact his life was a shining example of all the domestic virtues.

His funeral took place yesterday (Monday) afternoon. It was very largely attended. The burial service was conducted by the Rev. Thomas O'Neill, in the absence of Bishop March, who is in St. John's attending the Retreat. Mr. Kennedy had reached the ripe age of eighty years at his death.—R.L.P.
