#### Coffee When Boiled Loses Its Flavor.

The housekeeper who prides herself on her coffee realizes that the delicious flavor characteristic of the great American beverage when properly brewed cannot be coaxed out of the bear by haphazard methods.

For the past two years chemists in the department of biology and public health at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology have been studying coffee for the purpose of establishin facts of practical value to the coffee maker. One of their most importan conclusions as set forth by Prof. S. C. Prescott, head of the department, declares emphatically that coffee should never be boiled.

The reason for this according to Prof. Prescott, is that the boiling causes certain chemical changes which emphasize the bitter ele in the coffee bean and give coffee a harsh taste which does not appeal to the average palate.

BUT BOIL YOUR WATER.
