It is explained that they are in the field after Boxers. Prince Ching and Li Hung Chang have again urged Count Von Waldersee to ask the commands to desist from hostili-

Tien Tsin, Jan. ◆.—The German expedition, which started Christmas for Lien Chenghsu, under command of Col. Greuber, returned Thursday. Col. Greuber reports the capture of 43 Krupp field guns and the destruction of 2,000 rifes and large quantities of ammunition.

Yu Hsien Is a Dead One.

Paris, Jan. 7 .- The Foreign Office is advised from Shanghai, under date of Jan. 3, that advices from Sian Fu confirm the reports of the execu-tion of Yu Hsien (the former goverabout 50 missionaries whom he had invited to accept his protection). Dec. 10, by order of the Dowager Empress. Prince Tuan is still at Ninghia. There are 30,000 Chinese regulars at Sian Fu. The court has made no preparations to return to made no preparations to return to Pekin.

15,000 CHINESE

Armed With Modern Weapons Ordered by the Dowager-Empress to the Yangtse Valley.

Shanghai, Jan. 6.—It is reported from Sianfu that the Empress-Dow-ager has ordered General Feng Tse Tsai, commander of the Province of funnan, to proceed with his to the Yangtse Valley, and, from that section, to move northward. His force is said to consist of 15,000 men, armed with modern weapons. Count Von Waldersee, it is asserted, has arranged with Prince Ching and Li Hung Chang that the allied troops are not to operate in the prefectures of Shunte, Huan Ping and Taming, in the Province of Chili

Protestant Missionaries Meet.

Pekin, Jan. 5.—A meeting of Protestant missionaries was to-day to consider the terms of the joint note of the powers to China. A majority of the missionaries spoke on the subject. The consensus of opinion was that the note is not comprehensive enough.

Li Hung Chang Is Worse. Pekin, Jan. 5. Li Hung Chang has suffered a relapse, and quase of serious effects of this and of his great age, it is feared he will be unable to act as plenipotentiary in arranging a settlement of the troubles in China, and that the difficulty and delay in securing a successor may cause the postponement for a time of

London, Jan. 7 .- Chang Chih Tung, the Wu Chang Viceroy, wired the Chi-nese envoys, strenuously urging them to delay the signing of the note," says Dr. Morrison, wiring to The Times yesterday from Pekin, "until several clauses had been amended, and that portion of the preamble had been expunged which charges the Im-perial courts with the responsibility for the attacks upon the legation 'He further urged the Imperial personages not to return to Pekin on the ground that the joint note permits the powers to maintain 10,-000 troops between Pekin and the

London, Jan. 7.—"Reports have been received here from Sianfu," says the Shanghai correspondent to The Standard, "that General Tung Fuh Hsiang's 14,000 troops have muthied at Ku Yuen Chou, in the Province of Kansu, and that Gen. Geng Tse Tsai's army has been sen from the Province of Yun Nan to suppress the rebellion."

Russia to Defend China. London, Jan. 7.—The Vienna cor-espondent of The Daily Chronicle asserts that Russia, in her agreement with China, undertakes to defend the latter against any attack on her forts.

Paris, Jan. 7 .- Severe cold is re-

ported throughout France and Italy A foot of snow fell at Marseilles on Saturday evening, and the mercury showed 18 degrees of frost in Paris Sunday. There have been a number of deaths in the streets. Trains from a long distance are greatly de-layed. Snow has fallen in Southern Italy, and the city of Rome and surrounding country are snow-clad, for the first time in many years. Crowds assembled on the streets to witness the rare panorama.


