# A. F. OF L. CALLS ON U.S. GOVERNMENT TO START DISARMAMENT MOVE

Harding Is Urged To Call Conference of World Powers To Discuss Naval Armaments—Sinn Fein Element Presents Resolution Calling For Boycott On British-Made Goods.

Denver, Col., June 15 .- President Harding and Congress are urged to lead the way in bringing about world disarmament in a resolution presented today in the 41st annual convention of the American Federation of Labor.

They are requested to call a conference of the powers of the world, "with the hope and in the belief that through such conference the billions now being expended in navy armaments may be saved to the taxpayers of the several countries."

"The whole world contemplates with horror," said the resolution, the possibility of a race for naval power between the United States, Great Britain and Japan, similar to that between Great Britain and Germany, which preceded the great war.

'Such a race is inconsistent with and must serve to postpone and prevent general disarmament, to which the American tabor movement stands committed."

FAIL TO SUPPORT SINN FEIN. Sinn Fein sympathizers today replied to the warning sounded yesterday by J. H. Thomas, British labor leader, that organized labor of the United States could not solve the frish question, by introducing resolutions demanding action on the part of the convention sup-

porting the "Irish republic. Failing to get recognition in the resolution drasted by the commi tee appointed by a mass meeting of the Sinn Fein sympathizers, representatives of the "Irish republic" presented two resolutions demanding boycott of British-made goods and concerns in this country by United States workers.

The boycott resolutions, presented by T. J. Hind, secretary of the labor bureau of the American Com mission on Irish Independence, have caused the split among the Sim F ein faction to widen. They are reported to have been drawn by "high officials of the Irish republic," but they failed to get the support of the delegates who signed the resolution drafted by a committee of Sinn Fein sympathizers.

#### LIQUOR BUSINESS IN B. C. NOW IN HANDS OF GOVT.

Vancouver, B. C., June 15.— Canadian Press.—Sale of liquor under Government control in British Columbia started this morning at 11 o'clock. At mid-night last night the British night last night the British Columbia prohibition act became a dead letter. The store hours for sale of liquor in coast cities will be from 11 to 12 a.m. and 1 to 7 p.m. every week day. In up-country towns, selling hours are the same from Monday to Friday, and on Saturday from 10 to 8 n.m.

There will be no limit to the amount of liquor that can be bought by a resident under the spermit or of beer under the malt liquor permit. The quantities of liquor that visitors may buy on their \$5 permits, good for two weeks only, are limited. Holders of such permits are limited to one quart of hard stuff a day or two quarts of champagne other wines

There has not been any rush for the necessary permits. al-though they have been on sale for nearly two weeks.
