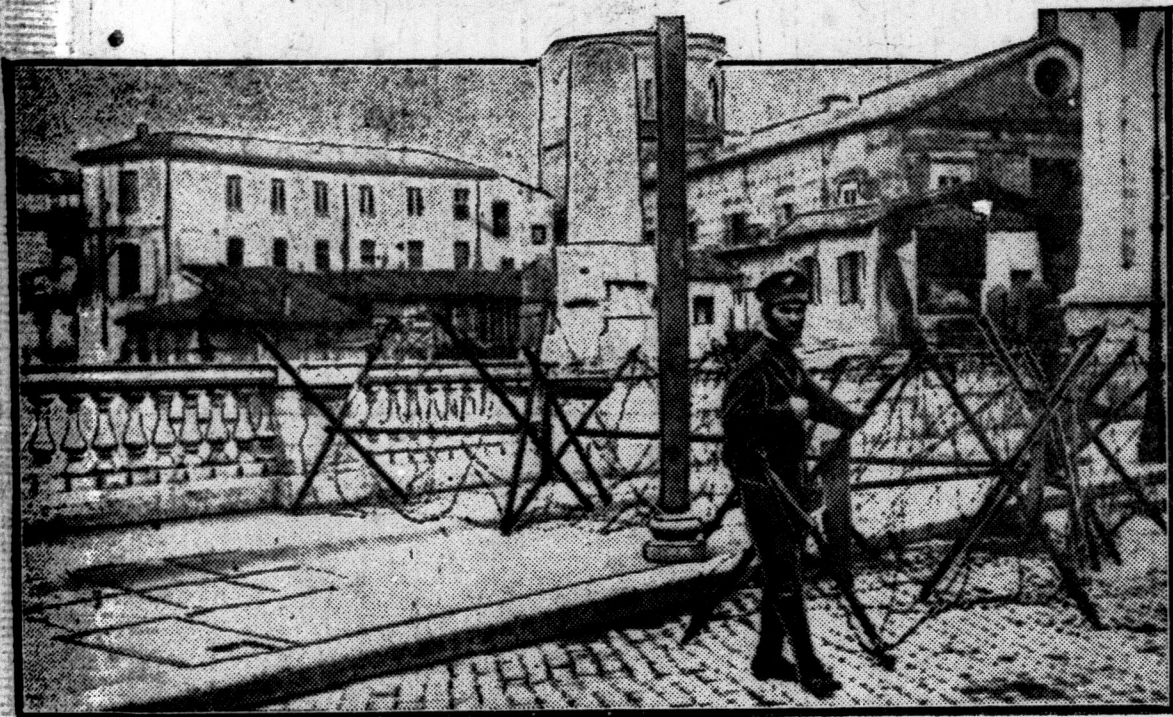

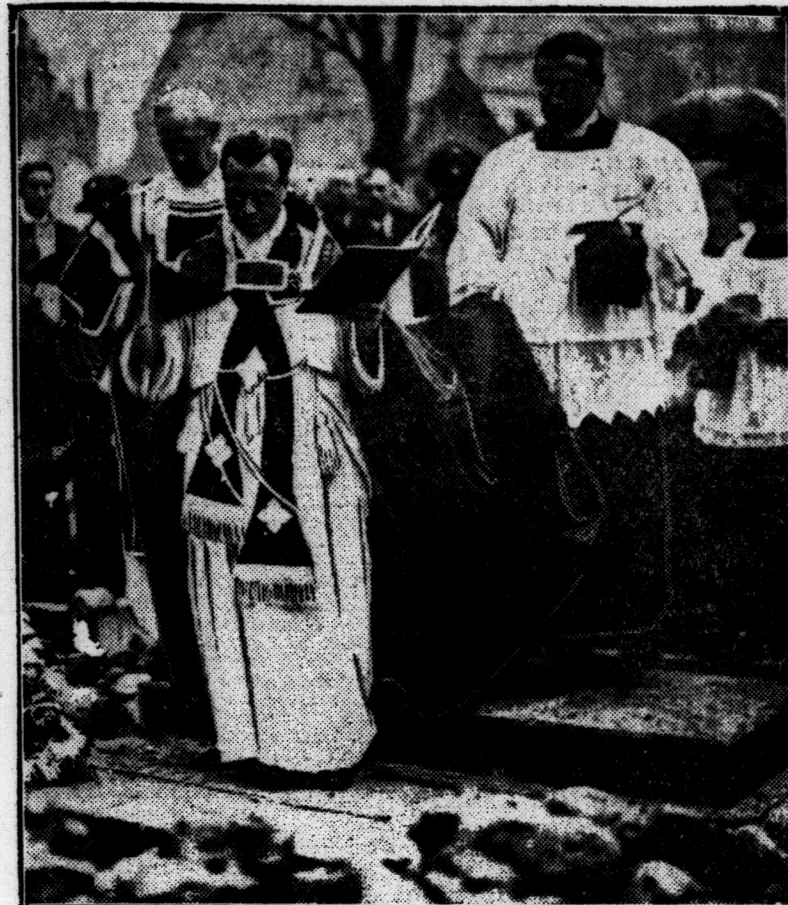
Barbed wire in Italy, too. A guard of the Fascisti at Arding Bridge.

Antonio Benatti, a New Orleans cobbler, has been found to have a good voice which is to be cultivated under competent direction.



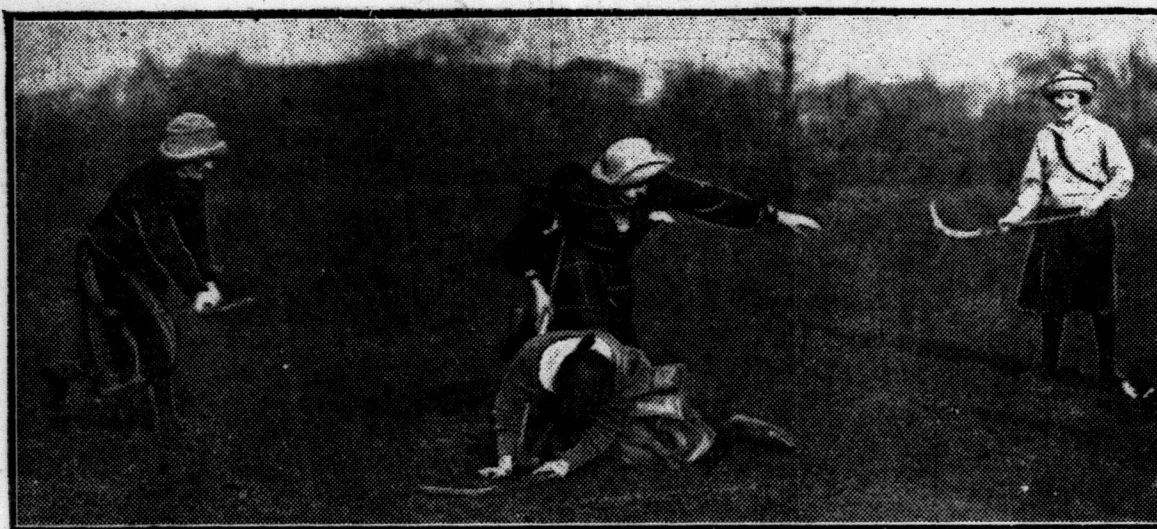
Canon Francis Vaughan, nephew of the late Father Vaughan, sprinkling holy water on the latter's coffin at the Kensal Green Cemetery.



Newton Hastings, the six-year-old Maryland boy who preaches often and who recently occupied the pulpit at St. Paul's Methodist Church in Baltimore.



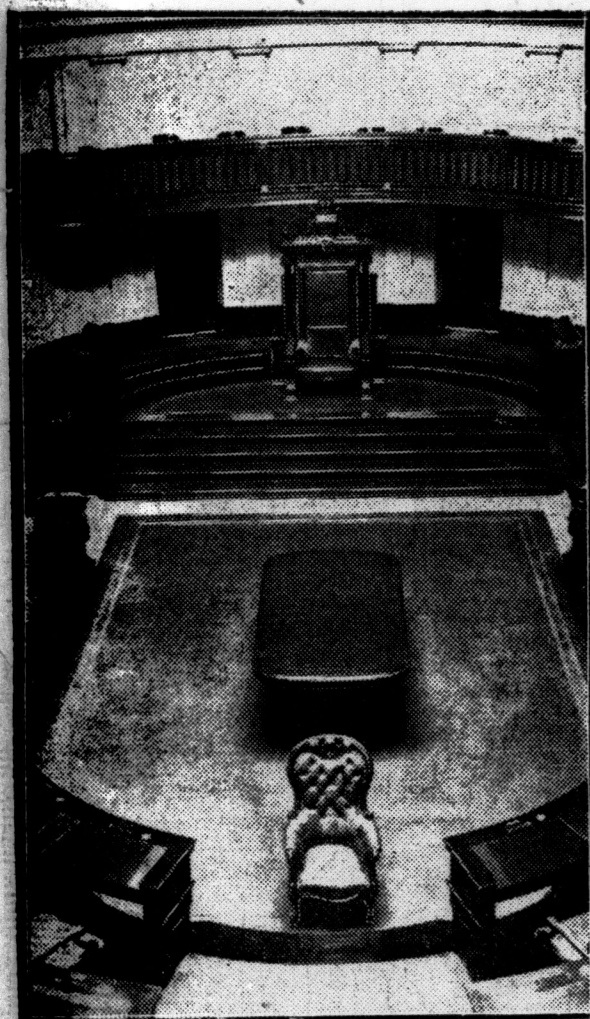
The Shah of Persia, left foreground, visits the military academy in Madrid. King Alfonso of Spain is in uniform behind the Shah.

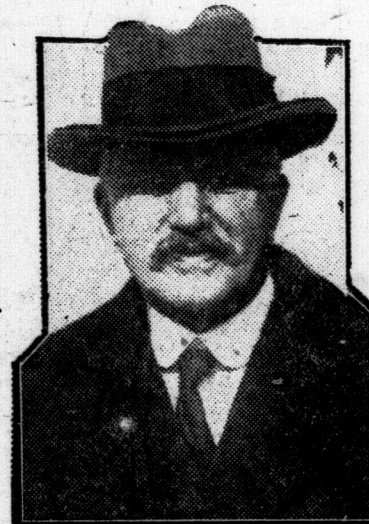
Charles Montgomery, president of the Chicago Drummers' Club, has imported this "bump jazz bass" which is being played by Packey Mulcahey.

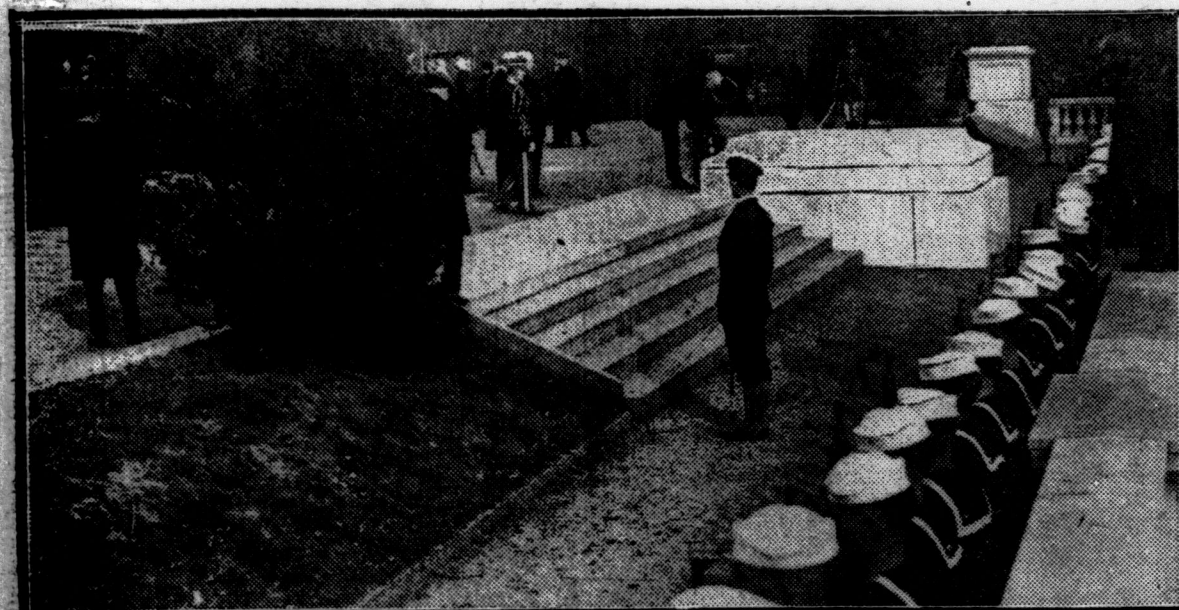
Guards patrolling the grounds about the ex-Kaiser's exile home at Doorn, before the wedding.
