


Dr. Karl Heinze, newly appointed commissioner representing the Reich in Saxony, now faces the problem of organizing the food situation throughout the country




Evelyn Laye, now playing in a revival of the "Merry Widow" in London, has received the unanimous vote of her audiences as being the prettiest girl in England


London policemen have taken up rugby as a means of keeping fit. In their first game against Charing Cross Hospital, one of the latter players is seen trying to get the ball against strong
