

NEW INDUSTRY A BOON TO GROWERS

Local Capital Interested in Establishment of Large Jam and Fruit Preserving Factory in This City.

An up-to-date establishment for the output of jams, evaporated fruits and preserves will soon be established in Victoria. A meeting was held last evening by a number of local gentlemen at which it was decided to form a company and erect a factory. The capital of the concern will be \$50,000. Mr. James Drummond, manager of the Victoria Fruit Exchange, is the moving spirit in the enterprise.

It is the intention of the company to import the finest quality of fruits and to allow them to mature because of the inableness of the growers to secure a market for their produce. There is no establishment here at present for

The utilization of this fruit and while there is practically an unlimited quantity of fruit going to waste, such products as the new factory will turn out have had to be imported in large quantities.

The establishment of such an industry will undoubtedly prove a boon to the fruit growers of the district. When in running order the factory will, it is stated, employ at the start from 25 to 50 hands. In a few days the organiza-

tion of the company will have been effected, and the start on the erection of the factory will be made.

GRANT TO GROWERS

The city will contribute \$500 towards the fund raised by the Victoria Fruit Growers' Association to finance an adequate exhibit of Island apple at the forthcoming National Apple Show at Vancouver. This amount was passed by the city council at its last city council, but the grant was accompanied by some remarks critical of the methods employed by Island growers. Aldermen Macdonald remarked that it was understood that some of the growers are shipping fruit of an unsatisfactory quality, and Aldermen Langille, while favoring the grant to the

A grant of \$500 will be made to Mr. E. C.
