The accompaniments for the cantata were very artistically played by Miss Mabel Thompson, who showed exceptional ability as a pianist, for so youthful a performer.

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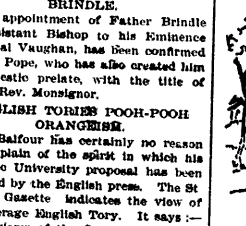
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
