1994 - Fourth Parliamentary elections

1995 - Accession of Austria, Finland and Sweden to EC

- Romania, Slovakia, Latvia, Estonia, Lithuania, and Bulgaria apply to join EU

1996 – Slovenia and Czech Republic apply to join EU

1997 - Signing of the Treaty of Amsterdam

1998 – Formal accession negotiations with six applicant countries (Cyprus, Czech Republic, Poland, Hungary, Estonia, and Slovenia)

1999 – On 1 January, exchange rates between the Euro and the participating Member States' currencies in the Economic and Monetary Union (EMU) are irrevocably fixed

- Fifth Parliamentary Elections

2001 - ECSC expires

2002 – On 1 January, Euro notes and coins are issued and on 1 July the Euro is the only legal tender in the participating countries.
