

(d) to keep the Canadian Government fully informed of political or other developments of importance in the country in which it is serving;

(e) to watch over Canada's interests in the country;

(f) to serve Canadians in the country;

(g) to take information about Canada available.

A constant flow of communication keeps the mission and the Department in Ottawa in close touch on all such matters.

Qualifications: Those entering the external service of Canada do so on a career basis under the merit system. Only Canadian citizens are eligible for promotion.

The work of a post is to know the country in which it is located. In a few cases this is done by a field officer who is stationed in the country; elsewhere it is done by a field officer who is stationed in the country or by a field officer who is stationed in the country or by a field officer who is stationed in the country.

The work of a mission is:

(a) to represent the Government of Canada in the country in which it is located.
