COMPANY

Motion No. 405—**Mr. Saltsman:**

That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency praying that he will cause to be laid before this house a copy of the correspondence, arrangements, etc. between the Government of Canada and the Government of Nova Scotia and Michelin Rubber Company of France regarding the removal of automobile tires customs tariffs and the establishment of a tire plant in Nova Scotia.

Hon. Herb Gray (Minister without Portfolio): Mr. Speaker, the correspondence in question contains confidential information about the planning and future operations of this company and it is considered that tabling of correspondence of this nature would be prejudicial to future full disclosure of such information by industry generally. However, I
