House that all commissioners, both full time and part time, appointed to that body did not hold political office at the time of appointment or during appointment?

DEDUCTION FROM TAXABLE INCOME OF EXPENDITURES INCURRED TO REPAIR DAMAGE TO SHORELINE PROPERTIES

However, I cannot see very well the relationship between the two matters he has mentioned. I will make sure that this difficulty does not exist, because employee negotiations and the restructuring of finances are two different matters.

INDEMNIFICATION OF THALIDOMIDE VICTIMS— ALLEGED STATEMENTS BY MINISTER
