the benefits. I cannot agree with my friends to my left who are afraid to sell a little coal. British Columbia has thousands of years of coal stocks, mountains of it. The development of the railway would open up a new portion of the province and allow ancillary mines and industries to develop through the area. Yet there are arguments, there is nit-picking, niggardliness rather than a push to make the deal and get the job done. The taxation accruing to the federal government from this deal would more than meet any up front money the government of British Columbia is seeking.

Early this afternoon an hon. member gave some figures for research and development in this country which illustrate how backward we are in this area. Out of a population of 23 million, 21,519 people are engaged in research and development. This must make us the laughing stock of the world. It is almost criminal that a government could avoid thinking about this, could avoid changing the situation.

This government spent all its time worrying about something the country is not worried about, that the country is not even thinking about. It forces us to do the same and ignores the real problems in the country, such as creation of more jobs.

I should like to see the government produce an industrial strategy for Canada, show concern for the small independent businessman, introduce a program to increase jobs and productivity, a program to bring in lower interest rates, a program to reduce inflation. The failure of this country and this government to deal with the key issues which concern the people brings shame on all who sit on the benches opposite. Mr. Speaker, this motion should be passed.
