Mr. Speaker, I should like to conclude by quoting a passage of La Sagouine which adequately describes the actions of this Government:

Sure enough, they say that promises will be made right, left and centre during the election campaign . . . You will get everything for nothing because you are first class citizens with the right to vote . . . It does not change anything, once the election is over the Government is too busy and could not care less about us.
