Dear Sir Arthur,-

Your letter of the 31st of January reached Calgary after I had left there and has been forwarded to me here.

I assume that you have seen the Will of the late Mrs. Eddy. Clause "U" of Paragraph 9 reads as follows;-

"To pay to McGill University of the City of Montreal in the Province of Quebec, Two hundred thousand dollars, to be used for the purpose of endowing and establishing such chair or chairs in said University as may be arranged between the Governing Authorities of the said University and "My Trustees and Executors", provided always, that such chair or chairs shall be designated as "The E.B. Eddy" chair or chairs".

Mr. Shirreff and myself do not quite know when we will be in a position to make the first payment to the University, but we are most anxious that the question as to what chairs should be established and endowed should be settled at as early a date as reasonably possible.

As we understand your letter, you desire is that the money should be used to endow two chairs, each, we assume with \$100,000^{and} to be known as "The E.B. Eddy Chair of Industrial Chemistry" and "The E.B. Eddy Chair of Municipal and Highway Engineering".

Mr. Shirreff and myself will carefully consider your suggestions. It may be that with respect to one of the chairs we will submit other views.
