⁵ *grattait...sanglantes.]* Was scraping a staved cask or pail, of which the bloodstained scrapings.

² *rompu et transi.]* Knocked up and chilled, i.e. benumbed with cold.
- 127.** ¹ *J'avais beau...raisonnement.]* In vain I submitted my impressions to reasoning.
² *département du Loiret.]* The department of the Loiret, situated in the centre of France.
³ *des taillis...culture.]* At some coppice-ground newly, i.e. lately, brought under cultivation.
⁴ *le défrichement.]* The clearing, i.e. the mode of clearing.
⁵ *Les Turreau.]* The Turreau family—the Turreaus.
⁶ *ça ne...boire.]* They merely knew how to work the ground, i.e. till the land, kill game, and drink.
⁷ *ça tourne...voyez-vous.]* They always turn to wild beasts, you see, i.e. they always become ferocious.
- 128.** ¹ *tous ces jours-ci.]* All these past days, i.e. for the last few days.
² *à notre insu...conduite.]* Unknown to us, the grounds of our opinions and the rules of our conduct.
³ *C'est à notre sagesse.]* It is for our wisdom.
⁴ *est un...province.]* Is an old historical chart, or record, coming from the most celebrated abbey of my native province.
⁵ *Déroulé avec complaisance.]* Unrolled with satisfaction (to myself).
⁶ *rongée de mites.]* Eaten by mites, i.e. worm-eaten.
