ADOPT THE CHANGES
PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 13.—All the changes proposed by the rules committee of the Baseball Writers' Association of America were adopted by a vote of the members of the association, except the rule known as "Cincinnati base hit." Secretary West announced that thirty-five members voted against the "Cincinnati base hit" and 28 in favor of it. Opposition to this was particularly strong among the New York and Chicago writers. The only other proposed change that did not meet with almost unanimous approval was that giving a stolen base and a battery error on the same play. This suggestion, however, was carried three to one.
