WOMAN SHOT DEAD

NEAR BROCKVILLE

Grant Kilborn, Farmer, Arrested on Charge of Murder in This Connection.

BROCKVILLE, Ont., Mar. 24.—Grant Kilborn, a middle aged farmer, living near Brockville, faces a charge of murder as the result of shooting Mrs. Josephine White, an elderly woman, with a high powered rifle on the farm with him.

The police say that Kilborn had been drinking in Brockville yesterday and on his return home brought a bottle of whiskey. Today the White family were moving out when the murder occurred.

Mrs. White encountered Kilborn with a 12-gauge shot-gun. Immediately there was a report, and the woman fell to the floor with the contents of a shell in her abdomen. Death ensued three hours later at the General Hospital, here.

Kilborn made his escape to the woods near the farm house, but in less than an hour he was captured by a posse accompanying the Brockville police.

Kilborn asserts that he did not know the man who was loaded on that there was such a thing as a shell in the house. He bore no malice or ill will towards the Whites, he states, and they were always on the best of terms.

SALVATION ARMY TO HOLD ANNUAL PARADE

The Salvation Army will again hold the annual parade on Good Friday morning, and have secured the permission of the military authorities for the muster to be held in the armories parade grounds. The procession is being formed, the massed bands of the Salvation Army, numbering three hundred (300) musicians, will render a monster serenade. U. S. AIM TO CONFISCATE OFFENDING STEAMSHIP

Proceedings Ordered Taken Against Interned German Liner at Porto Rico.

WASHINGTON, March 24.—Criminal prosecution of the master of the German steamship Odenwald for alleged violation of the neutrality laws by attempting to slip to sea from San Juan, Porto Rico, without clearance papers, will not be undertaken by the department of justice for the present. Although no official announcement was made, it was learned today that Attorney-General Gregory plans to concentrate attention on the proceedings against the Odenwald itself.

The prosecution will be begun in the United States district court for Porto Rico as soon as possible. The penalty in case of conviction is confiscation of the ship by the United States.

GETS DAMAGES FROM CITY

ST. THOMAS, March 24.—Mrs. Minnie Mohat, widow, 30, in the spring season, before Justice Outhwaite today, was awarded \$2800 damages and costs against the City of St. Thomas for the loss of her right arm, which was caught in a defective mangling machine while she was working as laundress in the Amasa Wood Hospital here last autumn. The woman, Mrs. W. J. Mohat, was suffering two weeks after the accident, was persuaded by the superintendent and hospital board to sign a statement settling with the city for \$300. She was not allowed to consult a lawyer. The jury decided the woman had been unfairly dealt with.
