

THE GREATER HALF OF THE CONTINENT.

"IN response to an urgent letter from C. C. BONNEY, Esq., of Chicago, ex-President of the Bar Association of Illinois, the editor of the *North American Review* has waived his exclusive rights, under the copyright law, to publish ERASTUS WIMAN's article, "The Greater Half of the Continent," which appeared in the January number of that periodical. Mr. BONNEY's request was preferred because, as he expressed it, he "felt that an article containing so much information, in such a compact shape, on a subject just now so interesting to the people of the United States, should be published in pamphlet-form, and thus secure a wider distribution than its appearance in a magazine afforded." As if in furtherance of this desire, a gentleman in Ohio (who does not wish his name mentioned), has provided a sum to print a number of copies sufficient to reach every newspaper editor, writer, and author, together with a special list, outside of these, of "men who think," recently compiled from all parts of the country. This will require an edition of ten thousand copies, which is now being printed and distributed."—*Toronto Mail*.
