The Jackfish gold belt promises almost as great things as the Lake of the Woods or Seine River belts. A number of discoveries have been made recently by Schreiber people and others residing in the vicinity. The country is very promising in experimental residing in the vicinity. The country is very promising in appearance and is not of a difficult nature to prospect. The recent discovery of a large gold-bearing vein a few miles east of Schreiber has been the means of sending many into the hills surrounding Schreiber. Not a very great amount of exploratory work can be done for the balance of the season, as the country will soon be covered by a thick mantle of snow. But with the opening of spring we look for very vigorous work being done in this district by prospectors and miners. There are indications that the Schreiber-Jackfish belt is from 15 to 20 miles in width, as gold has been discovered at a point some seven miles east of Jackfish.

Latest reports from Hawk Bay are to the effect that the vein is perceptibly widening and the character of the quartz much improved over that of the surface. It is well mineralized with galena, copper sulphites and visible free gold. 


