# **HOUSES REQUIRE** LICENSE, RULING

Ottawa Magistrate Holds That License Commission Has Power.

LIQUOR CONFISCATED

The case was much disputed in police court one week ago on the ground that a recent judgment handed down by Mr. Justice Masten held that any person could operate an export liquor business, in spite of the license department, providing that a warehouse was equipped with the facilities required by law.

**NEW PRESIDENT** Deschanel Will Resign When Polish Crisis Passes-Millerand May Succeed.


