The tender must be accompanied by a cash bonus they are prepared to pay for the timber over and above dues payable under award return furnished by a licensed culler of the timber cut each season.

The tariff of dues is as follows: Pine, \$2.50 per M. ft. b.m., or \$25 per M. cu. ft. Spruce, \$1.25 per M. ft. b.m., or \$12 per M. cu. ft. Tamarac and Cedar, \$1.50 per M. ft. b.m., or \$15 per M. cu. ft.
