CONSTITUTIONALISTS PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

To O.H.A. Rules and Orders—Will Be Voted on Dec. 3rd—No Radical Changes.

The time for receiving notices of motion to amend the constitution, rules of the game expired on Saturday last, and there is quite a collection of amendments to come before the annual meeting of the O. H. A. to be held at the Temple Building Saturday, December 3, at 10 a. m.

One amendment is to the effect that any club or player refusing to accept and obey the rulings of the executive shall be automatically suspended. The club or player and then suspends itself.

Another amendment proposes to fix the date for the annual meeting. To abolish the representation of clubs by proxy is the aim of another amendment.

Another proposal would be to change the playing rink to be not less than 90 feet in width and 120 feet in length.

Another would be to change the date of the annual meeting of the association from the second or third Saturday in November.
