When they returned his lifeless body was found a few feet under water. Efforts at resuscitation failed, although everything possible was done. The boy resided with his grandmother, Mrs. Margaret Delaney at 50 Douglas avenue, and had left home about 4.30 o'clock with several other boys. When

his companions found him the body was dragged ashore and assistance called. Dr. F. L. Kenney, coroner in West St. John, was summoned and gave permission for the removal of the body. He said that no inquest was necessary. The youth's mother is dead and the father is in New York. He leaves one younger brother, Blake.
