


ELECTION IS NEAR

Patriotic and Political Rally in Ottawa Scene of Announcement by Members of Parliament

A warning that a general election may be near at hand was given at a patriotic rally held by the Conservatives of Ot-tawa on Tuesday evening. The meeting was held while the \$11,000,000 estimates were under consideration in parliament, but several members found time to be present and address the rally. The meet-ing is reported in the Ottawa Journal (Conservative) under the heading "Warns Conservatives—Several members of parliament tell local club that elec-tions are near." Among the speakers was W. F. Cockshutt, M. P., who is quoted as warning his Conservatives to "Be ready for the day of battle, for it is near at hand.



Fishing Islands Must Furnish Their Quota, But Fishermen Will be Released For Spring Catch

Gloucester, Feb. 18-St. Pierre and Miquelon, the little French colony off Newfoundland, has been called upon to contribute to the French forces in the

Mail advices 'received today by fishing interests here tell of the sailing of the island's contingent of 300 men for France aboard the liner Chicago, which made a special stop at St. Pierre by order of the French Admiralty on the way from New

French Admiralty on the way from New York to Havre.

The government administrator, F. X. Chaubauch, announced that the colony would be expected to send 800 men to fight for France. But physicians found only 800 men whom they could certify

It is said that French fishing interests have notified the St. Pierre authorities that they will send 112 sailing vessels and about 40 steam trawing craft to the North Atlantic this spring to prosecute the fisheries as usual. Many men of Brittany who have join-ed the French army or navy, will be re-leased, it is understood, so that the fish-ing fleet may be properly manned.
